

Clinical Nurse Specialists and the Multi-disciplinary Team

A clinical nurse specialist in breast care (breast care nurse) is a trained registered nurse who has undertaken extra specialist education in the care of breast cancer patients. The breast care nurse can also be known as your **Key Worker**.

The Role of the breast care nurse

The breast care nurse provides support and counselling to people who are diagnosed with any breast diseases but mostly breast cancers. This is achieved by being present from initial diagnosis and maintaining support by the provision of treatment information, counselling and acting as the patients advocate throughout all treatment planning including radiotherapy and chemotherapy. In addition, we are involved in breast care education and the provision of information on breast care issues for many disciplines. You can contact your breast care nurse whatever your problem or worry maybe. She will give you her card and contact details with your information pack. If you cannot locate your breast care nurse – there are 7 nurses in our trust and any of them can give you advice and can be contacted via the main hospital switchboard.

People who are involved in your care

Every speciality needs a team of experts to offer the best treatment available. This is called a Multidisciplinary Team (MDT). The team is made up of people who are experts in cancer in different ways. There are people who can understand what cancer cells look like and how they behave and other experts who know how drug combinations work to get the best effect for the individual.

There are many people in the team looking after you as an individual.

The role of the MDT

To ensure that you are the one to benefit – your MDT meets twice a week. The first meeting on a Monday, is to diagnose your condition initially. The second meeting held on a Friday is where your surgery results are discussed and the treatment plan is developed for you.

If you have other scans or problems any time through out your follow up these will also be brought to the Friday meeting by one of the professionals in your team in order to discuss and make a plan of action with the whole team.

Specialist Breast Surgeons

This is a doctor who is specially trained to deal with and treat breast cancer.

This doctor is an expert in x rays and scans and mammography.

This doctor is an expert in looking at cancer cells under the microscope and details how they are behaving for the MDT to make a decision regarding your treatment plans.

Medical Oncologists

These doctors are experts in deciding which drugs will be most effective for your type of cancer and help with the treatment planning to reduce the risk of the cancer coming back or to help control it if it does come back.

Clinical Oncologists

These doctors are experts in giving specific X -ray treatment known as Radiotherapy. This treatment is also given to reduce the risk of cancer coming back – or can be used to reduce the effects of the cancer if it does come back.

Other specialists

Depending on your treatment plan, you may meet other professional and specialists needed in your care. These can include Radiographers, Sonographers (Ultra sound), Lymphodema specialist nurses, Prosthetic fitters (if you have had a mastectomy) benefits advice , extended counselling and other Macmillan Nurses who “dove tail” with your Breast Care nurse if you are needing further specialist care or if your cancer has come back.

You may also wish to meet a Plastic surgeon if you have had a mastectomy and want a reconstruction surgery.

Palliative care specialists

Sometimes – your treatment will involve you attending another hospital. If you need chemotherapy – that can be given at your nearest hospital. If you need radiotherapy, that treatment is only available at St James Hospital Leeds. There is always transport available to this hospital.

If you are having reconstruction surgery, some of the doctors only work out of Bradford Royal Infirmary so you may need to attend there.
